



Agapanthus 'Baby Pete'[®]

DRY TOLERANT

Origin: Brisbane, Australia

Species: *Agapanthus praecox* spp. *orientalis*

Protection Status: PBR protected



Features:

- Dwarf variety with compact mound forming foliage and flower stems only reaching to approx. 35cm
- Not classified as environmental weed as has proven to date to be sterile
- Long flowering - throughout warmer months
- Bred in Australia
- Evergreen and hardy, without any special needs
- Very dry tolerant once established

Suggested Uses:

- Mass plant as low maintenance ground cover
- Edging paths, drives and other paved surfaces
- Hardy for commercial landscaping or public spaces
- Container displays for hot, sunny locations
- Small gardens, patios and courtyards
- Dry or gravel style gardens
- Mediterranean-style garden or sunny herbaceous border
- Year round interest from foliage - ideal for edging or mass planting
- Great for coastal regions

Water Requirements:

Low. Once established, quite dry tolerant requiring only occasional deep watering during extended periods of heat.

Care:

Easy to grow in most soil types which are well draining. Apply a slow release fertiliser in spring. No pruning generally required although removing spent flowering stems will encourage further flushes.
