

Mona Lavender will be a standout feature plant in those hard to plant shaded areas. Its distinctive lavender coloured flowers are a prominent feature against the ornamental foliage of deep green leaves with dark purple undersides. Mona Lavender is a particularly attractive form of Plectranthus that does not spread like other members of the family, but rather forms a neat low shrub with an upright, erect habit. A wonderful solution to shaded areas in the garden as well as making an ideal container or basket specimen for sheltered patios or entertainment areas.

FEATURES

- Lavender coloured flower spikes from late summer through to autumn
- Ornamental foliage deep green leaves with dark purple undersides
- Attractive neat, low shrub with an upright habit. Does not spread like other members of this family

USES

- Ideal for low light positions in the garden
- Undercover entertainment areas and colour underneath decks
- Place around shaded water features
- Borders for shaded paths or driveways

CARE

Water requirements are low and prefers a moist, well drained soil. Choose a shaded to semishaded protected location. Protect from frosts and very low temperatures. A light pruning after flowering will help maintain a neat shape and encourage dense foliage growth.
